

Draft Submissions in Turnitin

You may submit numerous draft submissions <u>prior to the due date</u> in order to check your originality report/score, before you submit the final version for assessment purposes.

Please Note - after 3 draft submissions, you will need to wait 24 hours to see a new report.

Once the due date has been met, you will no longer be able to submit draft copies and your last submission will be final.

In general, originality scores above 25% will be critically examined. Please check your 'Student Handbook' for further information.

N.B. Veterinary Business Management Modules

Students completing a Veterinary Business Management module may find their originality report/score is unusually high. This is normally due to the requirement to integrate and reflect on previously submitted work and will be highlighted as such in the report.

Interpreting Originality Reports

Turnitin is not plagiarism software as such, it matches submitted text to any text available in the scientific literature or submitted as assessments to a variety of Universities/other institutions. Consequently, it will flag up text that matches these sources for a variety of reasons. There may be perfectly valid reasons for including some text that is not original, for example your reference list and laboratory reference ranges will be in standard format and usually get picked up, as will direct quotations. The important thing to recognise is that when an assessor views the Originality report they should be able to see that any matched content is for valid reasons and/or appropriately attributed and that quotations that are included are short and pertinent rather than large chunks of work being copied from the original source, even if that source is referenced. It is important that you review published information and paraphrase it appropriate, i.e. write the concept in your own words. This demonstrates your understanding and application of the material.
