A phenomenal 300 students completed our survey about their ideal student day, which has enabled us to tailor a relevant programme that will stretch and challenge the mind. It will prepare you for your next steps which will be crucial for your prosperous careers, with many new and exciting features.

The Programme

The day will start with an address from Declan O'Rourke, BCVA President, over breakfast. For the rest of the day students will be split into clinical and preclinical groups, to address the differences in knowledge and experiences across the Vet School career. Workshops and talks will be put on, with a trip out to farm and the chance to attend some of main Congress, too.

'Moo-niversity Challenge'

New for this year, and a highlight of the whole Congress, is 'Moo-niversity Challenge'. Panels of students will compete head to head in a light-hearted competition to showcase their random nuggets of knowledge about all things farm and veterinary. We are delighted to welcome the ever-humorous Jonathan Statham (former BCVA President) and Fiona Lovatt (SVS President) as question masters!

This is far from a formal competition, and we strongly encourage you to put your name forward to be on a panel and join in the fun. As an incentive, every panellist will receive free student BCVA membership for next year, entry into a raffle for four highly sought after President's Dinner tickets, and the chance to receive the trophy and take home ever-lasting glory.

Below is a little more detail about what the clinical and preclinical activities will involve.

Clinical Stream

Suitable for years 4, 5 and 6, this will feature the following:

- Time to attend main Congress and mingle with your future colleagues
- 'Making the change into practice,' with Lambert Leonard and May, which will be in two parts:
- What a partner is looking for in a new graduate: how to stand out
- Moving into practice, from the perspective of a recent graduate: your first year, the challenges and the fun

- Jobs fair: an informal chance to talk in person to vets who expect they'll have vacancies in the coming year

Preclinical Students

Years 1-3 will have engaging workshops focussing on the progression into clinical years. Highlights include:

- 'Understanding the routine fertility visit' workshop with Steve Smith from Midshires Veterinary Group. This provides inside knowledge into the process of a fertility visit, and discusses the dialogue between farmer and vet so that you can make the most of this integral farm visit
- On farm practicals about the clinical approach to a sick cow

During lunch students will have the chance to visit the poster presentations and the trade stands, which form a vital part of Congress. Finally, on the Friday night students are welcome to attend the President's Dinner too, which is an absolute highlight of the event.

Quick-fire rounds will run from 11:00 until 12:30 on the Saturday morning, where panels will battle for a place in the finals from 12:30 until 13:00.

Questions will not be particularly clinical and will not relate strictly to taught knowledge. We therefore encourage everyone to give it a go, regardless of which year you are in!

The first complete panel we receive from each University will be accepted for the competition, and will automatically be eligible for free student BCVA membership next year.

- Cancellation made at least 14 days before the event no charge • .
 - Cancellation made between 7-14 days of the event 20% of the event fee charged
- Cancellation made within 7 days event charged in full. •

From the North & East – Take junction 21 of the M1 onto the M69. Exit at the second junction which is junction 1, signposted Hinckley/ Milton Keynes A5. Turn left at the slip road onto the A5 and you will find the hotel 300 metres on the left.

From the West – Take junction 2 of the M6 and follow signs to the M69 North. Leave at the first junction which is junction 1, signposted Hinckley/Milton Keynes A5. At the bottom of the slip road, take the fourth exit onto the A5 to Milton Keynes and you will find the hotel 300 metres on the left.
