Use of Copyright and Site Licence or Agreement Software

The use of site licence or agreement software distributed by Computing Services on behalf of the University, is subject to the following general conditions. Please note that individual agreements may place additional conditions on its use.

The use of any Software, Computer Readable Data or Courseware or other similar material, issued or otherwise made available by the University of Liverpool to its students or members of staff, is subject to the following*minimum* conditions:

- Use of the product is restricted to use by any employee, student, or authorised person for the normal business of the University, being teaching, research, personal education, administration and development. Commercial exploitation, ie for monetary gain, is rarely permitted.
- 2. All of the requirements of the agreements, contracts and licences under which the Product is held by the Institution must be maintained. (Copies of the relevant agreements, contracts and licences can be viewed upon application)
- 3. The regulations governing the use of any service involved in the provision of access to the product must be maintained, whether these services are controlled by the University of Liverpool or by some other organisation.
- 4. Copyright Statements must not be removed or altered.
- 5. The Security and Confidentiality of any copy must be maintained.
- 6. No further copies can be made or knowingly permitted unless permitted to do so under the relevant licence.
- 7. The Product will only be used for the purposes defined, and only on computer systems covered, by the agreement, contract or licence.
- 8. Incorporation of some part or version of the Product in any work, program or article will only be allowed with the express permission of the Licensor or unless this is permitted under the Agreement.
- It is not permitted to reverse engineer or decompile the software products or attempt to do so unless this is explicitly permitted within the terms of the Agreement for the use of the Product.
- 10. All copies of the Product will be returned or destroyed at the end of the course/year/period of employment or when requested to do so.

The University reserves the right to take legal action against individuals who cause it to be involved in legal proceedings as a result of violation of its licencing agreements.
